LOGLINE

Respected professor and family man Ruben Esteban suffers a traumatic brain injury and nearly dies. At first, his family is relieved that he survives. But, as his wife Sonia discovers, the more he recovers, the darker and more dangerous his new personality becomes in this realistic psychological thriller.

SYNOPSIS

Ruben Esteban was a respected college professor and a loving husband and father. One night, while walking home from work, he saw one of his students being assaulted and intervened. The assailant turned on Ruben, and he suffered a traumatic brain injury that nearly cost him his life.

At first, Ruben's wife Sonia and daughter Jessica are simply relieved that he survives. But as Ruben recuperates, Sonia notices a change in his personality. A darker, more aggressive side of him starts to emerge, replacing the loving husband and father they once knew. Despite Sonia's best efforts, Ruben's mental state deteriorates after much struggle.

As Ruben grows stronger physically, his mental state worsens. Finally, Ruben, in his damaged mental state, starts to terrorize his family, forcing Sonia to take drastic steps to protect herself and her daughter.





OUR STORY

TexMex FilmWorks was created in 2021 by filmmaker Alex Avila specifically to create compelling stories without the tired, stereotypical depictions of Latinos historically found in film and television.

Noting that in Texas it is not unusual to see Latino lawyers, doctors, professors, business professionals, college students, and middle-class families, **TexMex FilmWorks** has as its mission to realistically create films which openly depict this reality while remaining focused on stories with universal appeal.

Consequently, we vow to never make a film project which predominantly features gangs, maids, criminals, drug addicts, cartel members, and other Latino stereotypes traditionally perpetuated by Hollywood films. While a viable segment of the Latino population identify as immigrants, we tire of constantly being portrayed as all immigrants in a nation where many of us have been here for generations.

TexMex FilmWorks is dedicated to sophisticated story-telling and award-winning productions.



Sara Casanovas as *Sonia Shahin-Esteban*

Sara Casanovas delivers a *tour de force* performance as Sonia Shahin-Esteban, attorney, mother, and wife to Professor Ruben Esteban. When Ruben's life hangs in the balance following a traumatic head injury (TBI), Sonia struggles to hold her family together, even as her own mother tries to drive them apart. Despite her efforts, Sonia is beside herself watching her husband's personality grow darker as his brain recuperates from injury. In the end, Sonia is forced to take drastic measures to protect herself and her family from the man she loves.

Casanovas was born May 3, 1984 in Ourense, Galicia, Spain. She is a veteran of Spanish television and theatre. She has won film acting awards in a number of European festivals including "Best Actress" at the following: Corto Festival DUNAS of Fuerteventura (Canary Islands, Spain 2010); Kimera International Film Festival of Campobasso (Italy 2010); Festival El Sector of Madrid (Spain 2010), European Festival of La Solana of Ciudad Real (Spain 2010), and Festival European of Cinema of Castilla La Mancha (Spain 2010).

She has won awards for her theatre work as well and is known in Spain for the TV series "Amar En Tiempos Revueltos" (or Hospital Central).

Casanovas is an actress, writer, and director.

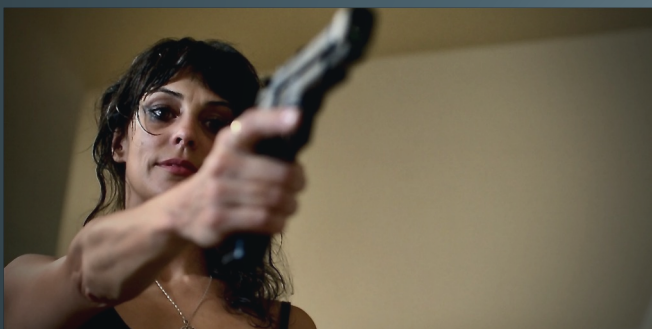


Director Alex Avila quotes on Sara Casasnova

"I was searching for our 'Sonia' for a couple of years. And I wasn't going to move forward with this project until we found her. I needed an extraordinary actress that could carry our movie."

Brian Villalobos as *Ruben Esteban*

Brian Villalobos gives a powerful and nuanced performance as Professor Ruben Esteban, a respected educator, former journalist, and family man, who suffers a traumatic head injury. While intervening in an attack on a student, Ruben's life is permanently altered after the attacker turns on him. Although he tries to recover and return to the family life he once enjoyed, Ruben finds himself losing to a dark and growing personality that evolves throughout his physical recovery.

Brian is a bilingual actor and performer from Texas with a career spanning over two decades. He has won numerous acting awards appearing in over 100 films, commercials, and stage productions, demonstrating his adaptability across various mediums.

Brian's work has been featured on platforms like HBOMAX, Netflix, Showtime, Amazon, Shudder, as well as cable and network television, including the Super Bowl. He has worked alongside recognized artists such as Jesse Plemons, Richard Linklater, Thomas Haden Church, Zachary Levi, Bruce Dern, Carrie-Anne Moss, Catherine Hardwicke, and Shaquille O'Neal.

"I knew early on that I wanted Brian to play our lead character of Ruben. And early on, he turned down this role – twice."

"I kept hearing from actors that the role was something they weren't sure was for them. And I understood. This role requires an actor to go to some dark and even ugly places. It's intimidating."

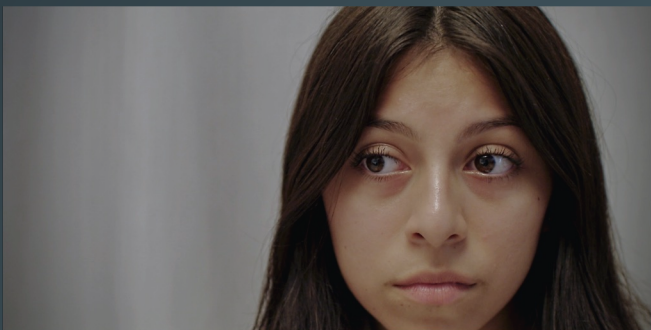
"Lucky for us, two years after turning the role down, Brian was open to having some conversations about playing Ruben."

Lucero Garcia makes her supporting actress feature debut as Jessica Esteban. Jessica watches as her father nearly dies then becomes a very different man. Lucero was born in Tamaulipas, Mexico and raised in San Antonio, Texas. She has been performing since she was 6 years old and made headlines as the lead performer in the award-winning stage play *Mariachi Girl* where she received the Alamo Theatre Arts Council Globe Award for *Best Lead Actress in a Musical*. Lucero is now a Psychology major at Texas State University.



Hector Roland Uribe as *Dr. Marcus*

Hector Roland Uribe is generally the harbinger of bad news as Dr. Marcus, trying to document Ruben's head injury and recovery and interacting with the Esteban family. Hector has been featured in a dozen feature films including the Coen Brother's classic *No Country for Old Men*. Hector is usually seen portraying character roles. He's the winner of the Queen of Palms Best Supporting Actor in *Tejano*, a film by David Blue Garcia. A retired attorney and former Texas State Senator, Hector studied Elizabethan Theatre as a Drama major before graduating from Law School at the University of Miami. He currently resides in Austin, Texas.



June Griffin Garcia as *Tonya Shahin*

June Griffin Garcia excels as Tonya Shahin, loving mother of Sonia and consistent critic of Sonia's husband Ruben. Tonya had married a wealthy attorney for both prestige and social standing, none of which she saw in Sonia's marriage to Ruben. As a multilingual actress, June has booked over 80 films and TV series in a panoply of ages, dialects and ethnicities. She currently teaches ESL full-time to adult refugees in San Antonio, Texas, and any spare time is devoted to salsa dancing.



Writer & Director, Alex Avila

A.J. "Alex" Avila, a Texas native, holds multiple degrees from the University of Texas at Austin. With a B.S. in Radio-TV-Film (1994), Avila's career began in journalism and pivoted towards film and media. He spent over a decade as a national radio producer for NPR's *Latino USA*, earning numerous journalism awards. He holds an M.A. and a Ph.D. in Journalism and has been a university professor since 2009.

In 1993, Avila co-founded and co-directed the Chicano/Latino Film Forum in Austin, connecting Latino filmmakers with audiences from 1993-1999.

As a writer/producer, Avila's feature filmmaking premiere came with *Closer to Bottom* (2017), winning "Best Texas Feature" at the inaugural Austin Indie Fest in 2017. His directorial feature debut, *Vecinos: Love thy Neighbor* (2021), won a "Gold Remi" Award at the WorldFest-Houston International Film Festival, and an Audience Award at Cine Las Americas in Austin, plus other festival awards. His latest screenplay, a Sci-Fi feature titled *A.I. Dad* won "Best Screenplay" at the 2025 San Antonio Film Festival.

As producer, Avila put together the team in 2023 that completed production of *Cerebral*, a psychological thriller set to premiere in 2024. *Cerebral* had earlier success as a screenplay in national screenwriting competitions. Avila's various screenplays have placed in over two dozen screenwriting competitions nationwide.

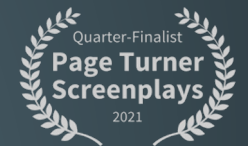
Antonio Garcia

Feedback from those competitions was vital in revising and improving the script, culminating in a “Top 10” finalist placing in Summer 2022 for *Table Read My Screenplay* (out of hundreds of screenplays.)

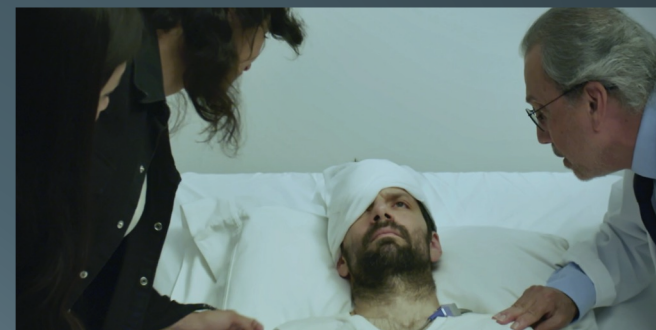
